Practice had just ended and as I walked off the field, I heard a teammate aim a backhanded racist remark at me. "You did pretty well today, Ryan," I'm actually pretty surprised because you're Asian." I stood there in disbelief, offering a polite "thank you" and wearing a smile that masked my inner turmoil. Behind my disingenuous grin, I understood that dismantling this stereotype and misconception would be a journey I would have to embark upon if I were to persist in pursuing my passion for football and breaking down the barriers that Asian American athletes face in the world of sports.</p> <p>I am Korean American. My mother was a first-generation immigrant from Seoul, South Korea, who sadly passed after her fight with breast cancer, and my father moved to California from Tennessee at a young age. An intersection of my Korean and White American cultures rendered me "too much" of one and "not enough" of the other. That moment at football practice was the first of many times I encountered a stereotype that Asians and Asian Americans couldn't excel in physically demanding sports like football. Yet, I stand here as living proof that such beliefs are nonsense. Looking back, the statistics were stacked against me from the start. My hometown of Temecula, California, boasted a population that was 62.2% White, and on my high school football team, I was one of only two Asian players. High school football players face a mere 3% chance of ever playing NCAA Division 1 football, and a mere 1.6% of all NCAA football players ever reach the professional level. Against all these daunting odds, I defied expectations.</p> <p>These challenges only fueled my pursuit of understanding and empathy. I recognized that these struggles did not define me; they forged my resilience. I am confident in my accomplishments and hopeful that I will no longer be discriminated against as I enter law school and the legal profession. My ethnicity doesn't burden me; instead, it has empowered me to overcome adversity when faced with challenges. My experiences have given me the tools to challenge stereotypes and promote understanding, qualities I am excited to bring to my law school class, making it a more welcoming and equitable</p>

Amidst the constant pinging from Microsoft Teams that defined my days as a paralegal, an unexpected email arrived. The subject line glowed with a lustrous promise: an opportunity to embark on a professional football journey across the globe in Japan. In that fleeting moment, I tried to balance the caution of realism with a more daring idealism. The decision demanded not just a leap of faith but an extraordinary leap across linguistic, cultural, and vocational boundaries. I knew I had to take this chance.

The invitation to play in Japan truly came out of the blue. However, the opportunity to play professionally was something that I had always thought was possible even from a young age. I am the first one in my family to have played sports at the college level let alone the professional level. Despite this, sports were ingrained into my everyday life. Every time one sports season concluded, my enthusiasm for the next, whether it was football, basketball, or soccer, took over. This ultimately fueled my successful college football career, with multiple seasons of being a starter and a contributor to whichever team I was a part of. Like many college players, I had a dream of playing professionally in the NFL and signed with an agent who dropped me instantly when that dream didn't materialize. But this experience only pushed me to become more interested in the legal side of the sport I loved. Leveraging my experience from signing an NFL agent contract, I became aware of the intricate details and negotiations involved in player agreements. Every aspect, particularly the wording of clauses and incentives, held significant weight so when it came time for me to negotiate my contract for Japan without representation, my experience and interest in legal matters sharpened my awareness of the fine details of my contract.

The terms of the contract were a combination of salary-based compensation and incentives contingent on my performance. Once I arrived, the biggest initial hurdle I encountered was a profound disconnect with my teammates. I could no longer rely on giving speeches or uplifting teammates with my words as a vocal leader. From this adversity emerged a transformation in my leadership approach. I would stay late after each practice to show my teammates drills to help them improve. Not a word was said, yet the actions themselves held great significance. I realized the necessity of leading by example, understanding that my actions held the potential to go beyond mere words and forge the camaraderie with my teammates that is necessary for success. I learned that there are other ways to be a leader.

My time in Japan revealed to me my capacity to innovate, adapt, and thrive in the face of adversity. As the Defensive Player of the Year and the recipient of my team's MVP award, I had woven my story into the tapestry of our collective triumph. But along with my pride in my individual accomplishments, I slowly came to realize some of the systemic disparities that seeped through the fabric of the game. American professional players, including myself, received fair compensation for our play, while our Japanese counterparts went unpaid. In response, I hoped to bridge the pay gap with small yet significant gestures of solidarity. Week after week, I took a portion of my earnings to share meals with my teammates. I was grateful for the fulfillment and opportunities to learn about new cultures that football gave me, but the experience inspired my sense of purpose and invigorated my commitment to investigating similar injustices within the broader sports industry.

The systemic disparities I encountered in Japan made me reflect on a similar issue plaguing the United States: the gender pay gap which is particularly rife in sports. The U.S. women's national soccer team has been leading this movement for equal pay in sports, most notably with their 2016 lawsuit that reached an agreement back in May of 2022 with the U.S. Soccer Federation. The results were equal pay for the women's national team and \$22,000,000 in back pay. This issue has propelled me back towards the realm of law that I had just left. A pursuit that began as an attempt to chase a dream evolved into a calling to address imbalances and reshape systemic norms through law.

This is exactly why I am pursuing law school now. I want to follow in the footsteps of the hardworking attorneys who advocated for the United States women's national soccer team in their class action equal pay lawsuit against the U.S. Soccer Federation. Inspired by these attorneys and my experience witnessing firsthand the pay gap in professional football in Japan, I am eager to pursue legal fields such as intellectual property law and international law because they are fundamental to effectively championing fairness and equity. By studying these areas of law, I can contribute to protecting the rights of all athletes. As I stand at this crossroads, my love for the game intertwines with a resolute commitment to advocate for equity, making law not just my academic pursuit but the means to effect transformative change.
